

Who Are You, God? Exodus 3:7-22 Days 8-14

Ultimately none of us can live on purpose until we understand and know who Jesus really is. To know God is to know Jesus, so this week we will take an in-depth look at who God is, learn some of his names and see what they tell us about his character. During Moses's encounter with God, he needed to know who God really was. God answers Moses, but not in the way Moses expected. Living on purpose requires knowing that our God is "I Am," the name that will be remembered through all generations.

Let's get started . . .

- 1. Review your notes from Sunday's sermon and Day Eight's reading. What stood out and helped you come to a deeper understanding of God?
- 2. Watch the "Who Are You, God?" teaching video. Write down and discuss any key phrases or questions that surface from the teaching.
- 3. The daily devotional chapters focus on specific names of God that help us understand him more fully. Which name means the most to you personally and why? What is it about that name that encourages you or challenges you to live with more purpose?
- 4. How does knowing that Jesus is Immanuel, "God with us," change how you think about your daily habits and activities?
- 5. As a group, read together each Scripture passage from the daily devotionals. Notice the names of God as you read. As you hear each name of God, share what that name brings to mind.
- 6. If you haven't already done so, complete the journal prompt for this week found on the individual purpose sheet and take some time to share your thoughts with the group.
- 7. As you end your time together, close with musical worship and prayer.
 - We recommend "O Praise the Name" (Anastasis)
 - As you pray, take turns describing who God is. You may want to use the phrase, "God, you are . . . " and thank him for all that name means to you.
